Cochran's Ski Area, Richmond, Vermont

Race Format:

- Race Trail: I-89
- Slalom - 27 mm, 60" pole
- 2 Runs Men and Women:
 - o 1st run - random
 - o 2nd run - reverse bib order on new course

Race Day Schedule:

- Jury and Course Setting - 8:00 lift
- Captain's Meeting – 8:45 at the finish area
- Course Inspection – 9:00-9:45
- First Run – Ladies 10:00, followed by Men
- Second Run- approximately 12:30

Awards: 30 minutes after completion of 2nd run, awarded to top 15 each gender by combined times.

Registration and Bib Pickup: Please collect your bib from the ticket booth (small gray building next to the lodge) between 8:00 and 9:00 a.m. Please return your bib to the finish area following your last run.

Race Fee: \$25 Please bring cash or check made out to Cochran's Ski Club

Parent Lift Tickets: Parent tickets are available in the lodge for \$10. Kids 5 and under ski free with the purchase of a parent ticket.

Snack Bar: Delicious breakfast and lunch options are available at the snack bar, including assorted muffins, homemade chili and soups, and grilled burgers.

Directions to Cochran's: From Interstate 89 at Exit 11 in Richmond proceed east on Route 2 to Richmond Village. Turn right at the stop light onto Bridge Street. Continue on Bridge Street over the red bridge to the Old Round Church (on left). Just past the Round Church turn left on Cochran Road. Drive approximately one mile; the ski area is on the right. **Please obey posted speed limits on Cochran Road as Richmond Police patrol it regularly.**

Parking: Upper and lower parking lots available. If possible please carpool. A limited amount of drop off parking is available in the upper parking lot. Please clear the drop off area after dropping off your racer. **Please do not park on Cochran Road; we have been informed cars will be towed if parked on the road.**

Race Day Medical Plan

Trails: I-89 and Race Trail

Race course is manned by race officials and Ski Patrol. Sled and patroller will be at top of course. Patrollers rotate as needed.

Treatment facilities:

Immediate care and care for minor injuries (bumps, bruises, etc) at the base lodge Ski Patrol room, which is fully equipped for basic first aid.

For more serious injuries, Richmond Rescue (ALS) Ambulance is dispatched from the Richmond village (5 minutes from ski area). Patients will be transported to the University of Vermont Medical Center, a Level 1 Trauma Center, in Burlington, VT (30 minutes from ski area).

If Richmond Rescue is unavailable, UVM Rescue ambulances serve as backup.
